Telehandler Training Courses Regina - Employers are responsible for making sure that their operating personnel and supervisors are trained to work proficiently utilizing telehandler machines. The competence level of employees need to be assessed. If deficiencies are found, employers must provide training so that workers obtain the necessary level of skill. The responsibility level of the person should be considered when training is offered. Effective training will solve whichever deficiencies in the knowledge, skills and understanding of telehandler operators and supervisors. Training may be undertaken through in-house session or by engaging the services of an external training provider. An assessment upon finishing the training period will determine if the learning objectives have been met or not.

Regulations and guidelines for the basic telehandler operator training and testing are set by federal, state/provincial and local regulators. Basic training does not address such topics as the lifting of suspended loads, the lifting of persons, the operation of rotating machines or using other attachments. Further training will need to be undertaken if such tasks are needed on the work place.

Maintenance and Inspection

The telehandler needs routine maintenance similar to any other machinery. The machinery would wear out eventually, so proper maintenance is needed to ensure the safe use of the telehandler machine. Checks and inspections are essential to ongoing maintenance procedures. Operators should have machine-specific training in order to rectify, monitor and prevent problems connected with wear, deterioration and damage. Staff need experience and competence in both periodic and breakdown maintenance. The manufacturer's preventative maintenance instructions must be seriously viewed and followed, taking into consideration such factors as frequency of use and environmental conditions in the work setting.

The responsibility for ensuring that the telehandler and its attachments are in good working order lies with both the owner and the user of the equipment. General maintenance is usually carried out by the telehandler owner whilst pre-use inspections are normally performed by the user.
