The illustrated safety manual consists of one hundred to two hundred fifty pages, that depends on the course, of vital and helpful material. Course materials include load charts and load chart exercises for the crane with which the individual training is working.

More than half of the course includes Hands-On Safety Training. Practical training is useful for increasing and developing personnel skills levels. Just licensed journeyman crane instructors are selected to teach the courses. Our instructors possess many years of industry experience.

Optional testing mechanisms are provided for all of our courses. Students will usually write tests both prior to and following training. A skills test is usually administered for programs that comprise H.O.S.T. People training will be graded and tested.
